Program Background

- A bike corral is a row of bike racks installed in a curbside lane of a street.
- Bike corrals are especially useful where demand for bike parking exceeds the space available on the sidewalks.
- DOT has installed twelve bike corrals city wide including four in CB 3.





Project Background

- Sidewalks on the Lower East Side are narrow and cannot accommodate large demand for bicycle parking.
- Teanyssimo Café and Misrahi Realty have agreed to be maintenance partners.
- In December 2012 CB 2 voted in support of a bike corral in front of Teanyssimo. We are now proposing a longer corral, which will be situated in front of Teanyssimo and Misrahi Realty.




Proposed Improvements – Teanyssimo

- Bike Corral with space for 16 bicycles
- Remove less than 2 parking spaces on south side of street
- Add two large planter pots
- Add flexible delineators
- Add parking lane stripe
