**Many of the MTA subways and bus lines are operating except in areas with power outages and severe flooding due to the storm. The Staten Island Ferry and several other ferries have resumed service. For more information on which subway and bus lines are running, call 311.**

## **Housing Preservation and Development (HPD)**

- To Tenants
  - If you have concerns regarding maintenance conditions in your buildings we request that you first speak with your landlord or building manager before calling 311 to see if the issues are being addressed. Our Code Enforcement operations are up and running and we are able to respond to complaints.
  - Please keep in mind that some conditions, such as no electrical service in areas where ConEd service is out, are not appropriately addressed by HPD code enforcement.
- To Multi-Family Building Owners and Managers
  - Multi-family building owners and managers with concerns regarding violations issued for conditions that may have resulted from the storm, please visit the HPD home page at [www.nyc.gov/hpd](http://www.nyc.gov/hpd) for a notice with information and instructions regarding this matter.
  - Please notify all tenants about any delays you are experiencing, keep them informed of the progress of repairs, and provide them with any appropriate intermediary solutions that you can. If heat is affected, please take any steps recommended by your plumbers, contractors, or other professionals to keep pipes from freezing, which could cause additional damage to your property and further delay the restoration of services.

## **HOMEOWNER ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS**

### **Neighborhood Housing Services (NHS) of NYC: Emergency Loan Program**

- **The Emergency Loan for 1-4 Unit Owner Occupants** provides homeowners with loans and grants to repair water mains, boilers, sewer lines, sidewalk violations, roof, plumbing, electrical problems and to eliminate conditions dangerous to health and safety. Other emergency repairs may apply. The maximum loan amount is \$10,000, with low interest rates and a maximum term of 5 years.
- **The Emergency loans for 5-20 unit Residential and Mixed-Use buildings - Landlord One** is an emergency loan for small property owners, corporations, non-for profit owners, investor, corporations and owner occupants of 5-20 units building in the five boroughs of New York City. Mixed-use buildings qualify as long as the loan is used to repair residential units or systems that affect the residential units. The interest rate to 5% (APR of 6.25%). The maximum loan amount is \$25,000 which is available in increments of \$10,000, \$15,000, \$20,000 and \$25,000. The funds can be used to: replace building wide systems; eliminate code violations; upgrade vacant apartments; eliminate dangerous health and safety conditions and other essential repairs.

## **Human Resources Administration (HRA)**

### **Temporary Cash Assistance**

For people who are not currently receiving cash assistance benefits and wish to apply for temporary cash assistance, HRA Job Centers may authorize payment for relocation expenses, such as a first month's rent, a security deposit voucher equivalent to one month's rent as allowed by state regulations, a broker's fee equivalent

to 50% of one month's rent, a furniture allowance or storage expenses, if eligible, and if not provided by federal or other disaster authorities.

People not currently in receipt of cash assistance and who cannot cook, due to, for example, a loss of power or temporary evacuation, but who are otherwise eligible for cash assistance, may request a restaurant allowance as an immediate needs grant at a local Job Center.

People who are currently receiving or eligible to receive cash assistance, and who must move into temporary shelter as a result of storm damage, and must place items in storage while in temporary housing, may request assistance with storage fees on a monthly basis, if not provided by federal or other disaster authorities.

People receiving or eligible to receive cash assistance who have lost or damaged clothing or damaged equipment such as furnaces and boilers may request assistance to help replace these items, if not provided by federal or other disaster authorities.

For cash assistance benefits scheduled to expire October 31, 2012, they will be extended to November 30, 2012.

### **Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (commonly known as food stamps)**

If you are currently receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in New York City and you were affected by Hurricane Sandy, you may receive an automatic replacement benefit for spoiled food due to power outages and floods. You may receive up to 50% percent of your household's October food stamp benefit without needing to apply. However, you must be a current food stamp client as of October 31 and live in an area of the City affected by the storm to qualify for this replacement benefit.

SNAP participants in selected zip codes in New York City have been scheduled to receive these automatic replacement benefits, including severely affected areas where flooding and power outages occurred. For zip codes currently scheduled to receive an automatic replacement, visit HRA's website at [NYC.gov](http://NYC.gov).

By receiving your replacement benefits automatically, you do not need to travel to apply at a local Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program office. If you are eligible, replacement benefits will be placed onto your EBT card the week of November 5, 2012.

You may also apply for non-automatic replacement benefits, if you are eligible and meet the following criteria:

- You must have had an active SNAP case by October 31;
- The food you lost must have been purchased with food stamp benefits;
- You must have lived in an affected area and had power outages or flooding caused by Hurricane Sandy;
- You must complete and sign appropriate paperwork explaining your loss by December 10.

You will need to verify you live in a storm affected area. HRA will review your request and if approved, benefits will be issued to you through your EBT card.

Those currently receiving SNAP are approved to purchase prepared foods at stores and restaurants that already accept EBT purchases. For re-certifications scheduled to expire October 31, 2012, they will be extended through November 30, 2012

### **Emergency Food Assistance**

## **Medicaid**

HRA is working with New York State to ensure Medicaid recipients' coverage will not be adversely impacted by disruptions caused by Hurricane Sandy. The Medicaid program is taking steps to give affected consumers additional time to respond to Medicaid renewals and other requests for information. All Medicaid community offices are open, except for Bellevue. You may call the Medicaid Helpline at 1-888-692-6116 for assistance or, as always, you may visit any Medicaid office in NYC.

Any NYC resident who lacks health insurance and, due to financial losses or other circumstances as a result of the storm, believes they may be eligible for public health insurance can go online to ACCESS NYC to see if they may be eligible, visit their nearest Medicaid office or facilitated enrollers to apply. You can also visit [www.nyc.gov/hilink](http://www.nyc.gov/hilink) for other options.

For those who need to make "Excess Income" payments to the Medicaid program, our 180 Water Street location is temporarily closed and is not accepting mail. You must come in person to the Medical Assistance Program, 330 W. 34th Street, 5th Floor, Manhattan, and ask for the DARB Payment Coordinator. Please make sure your check or money order has your Medicaid Identification Number and month of coverage requested.

## **Home Energy Assistance Program**

Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) helps low-income homeowners and renters pay bills for heating fuel, equipment and repairs, including boiler replacements. For more information about HEAP call 800-692-0557. HEAP season begins on November 19, 2012.

## **Home Care**

HRA is working with New York State to ensure Home Care recipients' services and Medicaid coverage will not be adversely impacted by disruptions caused by Hurricane Sandy. The Home Care program is taking steps to give affected consumers additional time to respond to Home Care renewals and other requests for information. All CASA offices in the community are open and can assist you in applying for services, including New York State's Managed Long Term Care programs.

## **Adult Protective Services**

HRA's Adult Protective Services (APS) can be called if a physically and/or mentally impaired adult 18 years of age or older is in need of services and has no one to assist them. Referrals or arrangements for services and support can be made Monday through Friday, 9 am – 5 pm: (212) 630-1853. APS is also referring clients to the relief food distribution sites in Manhattan, Queens and Brooklyn.

## **HIV/AIDS Services**

New Yorkers with AIDS and clinically symptomatic HIV illness who are not currently HASA clients can get assistance at any of the City's HASA centers. For more information and center locations, call the HASA service line at 1-212-971-0626.

## **Domestic Violence**

## **Child Support information**

All Family Courts are now open. If you had a child support appointment scheduled the week of 10/29 and were unable to keep the appointment, your appointment will be rescheduled for the week of December 17. However,
