

Sailors' Snug Harbor was founded by shipping merchant Robert R. Randall who stated in his will of 1801 that his property in Greenwich Village be used to care for "aged, decrepit and worn-out sailors." Land on Staten Island was purchased in 1831 and by 1833 the first structure -- Building C, designed by Minard LaFever in a monumental Greek Revival Style -- was completed. It established the core of the institution which developed around it over the course of the 19th and early 20th century. At its peak, Sailors' Snug Harbor was considered to be the nation's grandest ensemble of buildings and grounds devoted to the care of aged seamen.

The proposed 80-acre Historic District embraces the surviving half of the original Snug Harbor grounds; the southern half was sold to developers in the 1930s. In addition to the previously designated New York City Landmarks -- the front row of Greek Revival buildings (Buildings A-B) constructed between 1833 and 1881, the 1855 Chapel and the Richmond Terrace fence and gatehouse -- the proposed Historic District includes approximately twenty-two additional structures which range in date from the 1845 Wash House through the 1916 Recreation Hall. A wide variety of styles from Greek Revival through neo-Georgian is represented as well as a range of building types. These include such simple utilitarian structures as the 1891 Vegetable Storage House and far more imposing buildings such as the neo-Classical Music Hall of the early 1890s.

Extensive remains of the Harbor's landscaping also survive together with monuments to Richard Randall and the large Neptune's Fountain of 1893. Although a number of the Snug Harbor buildings have been demolished, those which remain, together with the surrounding grounds, are considered to retain their power to evoke the character of this unique institution at its zenith.

RESOLUTION

The Snug Harbor Cultural Center supports the plan to designate the entire site of Snug Harbor as an historic landmark district. Within this district we recommend that the buildings referred to as "M" or Maintenance, "L" as Laundry, and the greenhouse be noted as having little or no historic significance from an architectural viewpoint. We further enjoin the Landmarks Preservation Commissioners and staff to be mindful of the fact that our mandate from New York City is to adapt the buildings and grounds of Snug Harbor to contemporary cultural and commercial uses as well as to preserve them. In this process we expect to work with the commissioners and staff in both a meaningful and reasonable process, and we have been assured by them that this will be the case. We welcome the continuation of the dialogue with the Landmarks Preservation Commission and the future formalization of the advisory relationship between the Commission and our organization.

Dear Commissioner Norman:

Noting that there are historic ties between Greenwich Village and Sailors' Snug Harbor, since the establishment of Sailors' Snug Harbor was made possible by a bequest of Greenwich Village land, the Board of Trustees of the Greenwich Village Society for Historic Preservation at their meeting of November 14, 1984, passed a resolution urging the Landmarks Preservation Commission to designate the proposed Sailors' Snug Harbor Historic District. The setting of this important group of Greek Revival institutional buildings in an extensive parkland is an original feature of Sailors' Snug Harbor which should be preserved, and the entire central complex of buildings deserves to be kept intact, especially buildings F (1878), G (1855) and H (1876), which in fact pre-date the already protected buildings A and E, and are part of a stylistically unified group which is the only example of its kind within the boundaries of New York City.



Honorable Chairman Norman, Honorable Commissioners:

My name is Halina Rosenthal, and as the President of Friends of the Upper East Side Historic Districts, I wish to reiterate our support for the designation of the Sailor's Snug Harbor Historic District.

At the risk of stating the obvious, we wish to say, that here is a unique opportunity to create within an already existing extraordinary space, filled with no less extraordinary buildings an extraordinary facility, and productive center which would promote all sorts of educational and cultural activities and benefit not only Staten Island but the entire city.

We know that there already exists a Children's Museum and a Day School, we know that there is a Botanical Garden on the grounds, we know that the Staten Island Institute of Arts and Sciences will be moving to the Harbor, and that it will bring with it the vast resources of its library and archives. We know that while its reconstruction was in progress, the Museum of Modern Art loaned its outdoor sculpture collection to be exhibited outside. We know about what is there, but the stabilizing effect of a Historic District can do so much more...

We have a vision of facilities which can be housed and accommodated there, were there such a thing as a non collegiate campus, the Sailor's Snug Harbor Historic District could be it. The possibilities are endless. A center for the study of Art and Design, a center for the production and presentation of performing arts, A School of music, and what could be more appropriate than a center for the study of the sea and the dangers that our civilization is creating for it. The study of technology and environment in general terms, etc.etc. And then of course following the example established by such institutions as PS1 in Queens, studios and exhibition space for resident (and visiting) architects, artists and designers coming from other parts of the country or abroad.

Following in the footsteps of Wave Hill in the Bronx, or Storm King, Upstate, there could be temporary or permanent outdoor art exhibits. (The Public Art Fund could be enlisted for guidance) and we know how much excitement and what type of attendance can be generated through such activities. Given the availability of the existing grounds, there are many varied possibilities for broad recreational and sports facilities.

Am I repeating what has already been proposed, studied etc. Perhaps so, but perhaps too, one has to repeat a lot in order to be heard and to achieve the necessary goal. And the goal is simple, this Historic District already exists... It is all here for us to take advantage of and to fulfill the original hopes and intentions of Robert R. Randall when he envisioned this area as a snug and safe harbor. The use may not be the same as what the need for it was in the



Sailor's Snug Harbor Historic District

It is understandable that in 1965 the Landmarks Preservation Commission designated only the very most prominent and striking buildings at Sailor's Snug Harbor, since the Landmarks Law was then relatively new, and the then owners not only opposed designation but attempted to reverse it in court. Now the time has come to protect the remainder of this extraordinary complex of buildings and the parkland around them. The park still retains 19th century features such as the fish pond and the tree lined road which led to the hospital and the orphanage (now destroyed.) There are still bluestone pavings and old chestnut trees and open fields which preserve a memory of Staten Island as it appears in views engraved in the 1830s and 40s, preserved in the Eno Collection in the New York Public Library. As Staten Island will probably continue to lose open space and wild country, the proposed District could become a very important park. The remaining out-buildings, such as the Vegetable Storage House and the row of Victorian "cottages", are unique survivals of an earlier New York which have both architectural charm and historic interest. Buildings F, G and H are an integral part of the main complex. At the 1965 designation hearings, the Society of Architectural Historians testified: "These distinguished buildings form a Greek Revival group composition of pre-eminent interest in the United States. Its loss, in whole or in part, would be a matter of major national landmark concern." The Architect's Council of the City of New York stated: "In pleading for the preservation of the buildings, we also speak for the site as a whole. For here we have, in Metropolitan New York, an unusual and most significant total environment of the last century." Both of these comments still stand today. I hope the Commission will act promptly to designate this unique and beautiful district.

STATEMENT IN SUPPORT OF THE LANDMARK DESIGNATION OF THE SAILORS' SNUG HARBOR

The New York Landmarks Conservancy is a private, not-for-profit organization dedicated to the preservation and continuing use of architecturally, historically and culturally significant buildings throughout the state. The Conservancy supports the landmark designation of a Sailors' Snug Harbor historic district on Staten Island.

A number of the 20-odd buildings in this historic 80-acre complex are already designated New York City landmarks, and the entire site has been listed on the National Register of Historic Places since 1976. Special attention has been given to the distinguished main buildings--perhaps the finest grouping of Greek Revival structures in the U.S.--and the 1855 Chapel. Yet, the historical value of Snug Harbor lies largely in the setting of all the buildings, of various date and style; in the context of their original use as home and community to thousands of retired seamen. The buildings, from vernacular to Beaux Arts, illustrate changing architectural trends and styles from the 1830s into the 20th century, while the complex as a whole provides a well-preserved view of the social and cultural life of its residents.

Sailors' Snug Harbor is unquestionably worthy of landmark status as an historic district and we urge that the Commission designate it as such without delay.

Mr. Chairman:

My name is Jan Hird Pokorny, I am a member of the Historic Buildings Committee of the American Institute of Architects. Today I also represent the New York Chapter of the American Institute of Architects, the Fine Arts Federation of New York and the Associates of the Art Commission of the City of New York.

On behalf of these organizations I am here to testify in support of the proposed designation of the entire Sailor's Snug Harbor property as an Historic District. Our reasons are the following:

The most architecturally significant Greek revival buildings have already been designated City Landmarks in the late 60's. However, many of the 22 still unprotected, younger Victorian structures of the Sailor's Snug Harbor complex are in close proximity with the designated landmarks, often physically connected with them and with each other by covered passageways and bridges. All together these structures form a splendid, integrated and harmonious entity. It is this closely knit assemblage of buildings with its landscaped grounds and the park-like open space beyond it that still powerfully evokes the atmosphere and character of the remarkable institution that built and occupied this compound. It is, in our opinion, this total assemblage that needs to remain intact and should receive the protection which only an Historic District designation can provide.

The new uses the Staten Island Cultural Center will house in the historic buildings of Snug Harbor will inevitably generate pressures for expedient changes, additions and maybe, in the long run, new structures and other facilities. An Historic District designation will provide the needed controls, assuring lasting integrity of this historically significant institution and most unique architectural monument.



During the November 18th Public Hearing concerning the designation of Snug Harbor as a New York City Historic District you were interested in learning more about the extent of city funded operating support currently being provided to Snug Harbor Cultural Center Inc.

I am enclosing a history of expense budget funding for Snug Harbor, for the Staten Island Institute of Arts & Sciences, and for the Staten Island Children's Museum as well as a summary of capital projects currently in process.

You will note that as with all of the Cultural Institutions currently receiving operating support from the Department of Cultural Affairs the three Snug Harbor constituent organizations have enjoyed increasing benefits from their relationships with the City. You should also be aware that a proportion of Snug Harbor's budgeted support is earmarked for the Staten Island Botanical Garden.

Steps are being taken toward economizing such as the installation of a centralized cooling plant and the proposed consolidation of duplicative administrative costs: bookkeeping, maintenance, security, etc., that are now being carried out individually by each of the institutions.

If you require more details on either expense or capital funding for the Harbor, or on any other aspects of this important project, please don't hesitate to ask.


