

Who Are We

OATH is an independent administrative law court. We provide New Yorkers with a fair and neutral forum where summonses or tickets issued by the City's various agencies can be contested. As the administrative court responsible for providing New Yorkers with due process and an opportunity to have their day in court, our primary mission is to conduct impartial hearings and issue timely decisions.

What We Do

Trials Division

OATH's Trials Division holds trials on a diverse range of complex administrative matters including:

- Disciplinary cases relating to the City's 325,000 civil servant workforce
- City contract disputes
- Denials of marriage license
- Revocations of City-issued license
- Loft Board, SRO and zoning issues
- Car seizures by police during arrest
- Human rights and discrimination cases

Hearings Division

Most New Yorkers will come into contact with OATH through its Hearings Division. The Hearings Division is currently comprised of three administrative courts: the Environmental Control Board, the Health Tribunal and the Taxi and Limousine Tribunal.

Access To Justice

The Hearings Division receives approximately 750,000 summonses each year from the City's various enforcement agencies, such as the Buildings Department, Sanitation Department, Health Department, Fire Department and Department of Environmental Protection (noise), among others.

Most New Yorkers will represent themselves at OATH hearings. For this reason, OATH strives to make the hearing process as accessible and as convenient as possible by providing various ways to contest a summons.

OATH provides instantaneous, free interpretation at all types of hearings and trials.

OATH also accepts forms, applications and defenses that are written in foreign languages and will translate the submission free of charge.

The Future of OATH

With a focus on how to provide exceptional convenience to New Yorkers who are summoned to our courts, OATH is embarking on an agency-wide transformation.

By streamlining all rules, procedures and processes, OATH is making it easier for New Yorkers to contest summonses they receive from City agencies. The Hearings Division is being converted from its three different courts into one, single court which will be responsible for all administrative hearings that are conducted by OATH.

OATH will have One-Stop Hearing Centers in every borough which will provide individuals and small businesses with the opportunity to deal with summonses issued by any City agency before an independent and impartial tribunal with one uniform procedure.

The Trials Division will remain at OATH headquarters, located at 100 Church Street in Manhattan, and will continue conducting trials on the complex administrative law cases.
