DOMESTIC VIOLENCE EMERGENCY SHELTER*

There are 2,724 domestic violence emergency shelter beds citywide, a 35% increase since January 2002.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE CALLS FOR ASSISTANCE*

Police responded to 257,813 domestic violence incidents in 2011; this averages to over 700 incidents per day. In addition, NYPD's Domestic Violence Unit conducted 73,016 home visits in 2011, a 91% increase since 2002.

As of 9/30/2012 the City's Domestic Violence Hotline advocates answered 85,020 calls since the beginning of the year. In 2011, the City's Domestic Violence Hotline advocates answered 114,760 calls, averaging more than 310 calls per day.

DATING VIOLENCE PREVENTION

Since its inception in 2005 through September 30, 2012, the New York City Healthy Relationship Training Academy of the Mayor's Office to Combat Domestic Violence has reached 28,986 young people through 1,479 peer education workshops. PROJECT H.E.A.L. (Hospital Emergency Assistance Link)

City public hospitals have digital cameras that document injuries and Domestic Violence Coordinators who assist victims and connect them with social and legal services.

NEW YORK CITY FAMILY JUSTICE CENTER, BROOKLYN

Since opening in July 2005 through September 30, 2012, this center has served 51,283 new clients seeking domestic violence services and 9,748 children were supervised in the Center's Children's Room, Margaret's Place. There have been 112,286 adult client visits to the Center since it opened.

NEW YORK CITY FAMILY JUSTICE CENTER, QUEENS

Since opening in July 2008 through September 30, 2012, this center has served 16,426 new clients seeking domestic violence services and 3,312 children were supervised in the Center's Children's Room, Margaret's Place. There have been 43,574 client visits to the Center since it opened.

NEW YORK CITY FAMILY JUSTICE CENTER, BRONX

Since opening in April 2010 through September 30, 2012, this center has served 11,998 new clients seeking domestic violence services and 3,002 children were supervised in the Center's Children's Room. There have been 31,846 client visits to the Center since it opened.
