Description of the Office:

The Mayor's Office to Combat Domestic Violence (OCDV) formulates policies and programs; monitors the citywide delivery of domestic violence services; and works with diverse communities to increase awareness of domestic violence. OCDV works closely with community leaders, health care providers, City agencies and representatives from the criminal justice system to create solutions that are critical to preventing domestic violence in New York City.

Intern responsibilities include:

- Flexible schedule, at least 10 hours/week during business hours;
- Assisting with mixed-methods Community Needs Assessment in Brooklyn;
- Design and implement qualitative and quantitative components of the research project;
- Data analysis using SPSS;
- Attend meetings with OCDV program staff; and
- Other tasks as assigned.

Qualifications:

- Masters level student;
- Superior writing skills and computer skills, knowledge of SPSS preferred;
- Experience with or interest in qualitative research;
- Strong interest in the topic of domestic violence;
- Ability to work well in a team environment;
- Interest in project planning and/or management;
- Knowledge of community outreach; and
- Self-directed and highly organized.
