

This year marks the Twentieth Anniversary of the nationwide commemoration of Women's History Month. The designated theme in 2001 is "Celebrating Women of Courage and Vision."

Looking back over the last hundred years, we see the accomplishments of outstanding women representing different cultures and nationalities who have been involved in significant areas of human endeavor.

As we enter the millenium, we recognize these multicultural women whose courage and vision made history. In our daily lives we are reminded of the enormous impact these women have had on our lives and by honoring their courage and vision we set a standard for ourselves and provide a beacon of inspiration for future generations.

Statistics reveal that women's self-reliance and productivity are more important than ever. Women who make up 52% of the population can no longer be ignored and their talents must be utilized.

- Eighty-five percent of all women will be solely responsible for themselves at some point in their lives.
- Fifty percent of marriages end in divorce, at which time a woman's standard of living drops forty-five percent.
- The average age of widowhood is fifty-six.
- A man's life expectancy is seven years less than a woman's.
- Twenty-five percent of women over the age of sixty-five live solely on social security. In 1996, the average social security payment was \$633 per month.
