Rebuilding Together NYC is a nonprofit organization supported entirely by contributions of time, labor, material and money. We are dedicated to repairing homes of those who, due to financial hardship, age, and/or disability, cannot do the work themselves. Skilled and unskilled volunteers, contractors, and (when feasible) able-bodied members of the recipient's family and friends complete the repairs at no cost to the recipient.

We are looking forward to a Spring 2011 "Neighborhood Rebuilding Day," where we will repair several homes in a neighborhood in Brooklyn, and we are considering you and your neighbors as possible recipients for this program. Bedford Stuyvesant Restoration Corporation is working with us to identify neighborhoods such as yours.

To be eligible for consideration in the program, you must:

- Own and live in your home
- Be low income per federal guidelines

Home safety is the first priority of Rebuilding Together NYC. Volunteers and skilled trades people provide improvements that enhance the safety and comfort of your home. We need you to understand that time may prevent the volunteers and skilled trades people from accomplishing everything that you would like to have done in your home. Please include a verification of the homeowner's income with the application. Please do not send your application by priority or express mail; regular mail is fine.

If you have any questions about the program or if you need assistance in completing the application, contact Rebuilding Together NYC at 212.362.1636. If the application is complete, we will arrange for a site visit by Rebuilding Together NYC. The information they gather will be used in determining sites to be repaired this year.
